Some programs will have an age range, usually 6-10 years, to get the most out of the event. Sometimes older and younger siblings can be accommodated. In many cases, we can create a special history program to meet the needs of your group, by arrangement with the director, Karen Rainsong.

The SCEC provides BMD's Kids Zone this year. To honor the festival's 60th "Diamond Jubilee" theme *Diamonds in the Rough*, the Living History Village highlights Cottage Grove's most famous "diamond in the rough", Opal Whiteley, the girl pioneer who communicated with animals and nature spirits.

The Living History Village includes the SCEC's favorite pioneer activities such as: Washing clothes on the washboard, petting the horse, working the loom, spinning wool, making a corn doll, and making a leather bracelet. Kids can make their own Fairy House and meet an Opal Whiteley-look-a-like. Take a selfie with her and post it on the BMD Facebook Page to win a \$25 gift card from Domino's Pizza!
